To promote co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the student, activities will be graded on a 5-point grading scale (A to E) and will have no descriptive indicators. No upscaling of grades will be done.

3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Value):

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps build character. Sincerity, good behavior and values develop strength and foster unity and co-operation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a Five-point scale (A to E).

The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (10+5+5) entails objectivity and a structured approach.

PEN PAPER TESTS

Pen Paper test must test core competencies and discourage rote learning. An Ideal pen paper test must be balanced, with a variety of question items ranging from testing knowledge to understanding, application of concepts, analysis, evaluation and creative expression (Bloom's Taxonomy).

DIFFICULTY LEVEL :The difficulty level of the test must be such that 50% test itmes can be attempted by an average student, 40% by good students and 10% by extremely outstanding students.

TYPOLGY OF QUESTION :

- VSA- Very Short answer type (including objective type- True/ False, Fact/Opinion, Match the following, Analogy, Fill in the Blanks, MCQs, Assertion-Reason, One word/line answer question)
- SA- Short Answer type (Subjective type; word limit from 20 to 60 words)
- LA- long Answer type (Subjective type; word limit from 60 to 100 words)
- Case-study based questions
- LOTs (Lower Order Thinking Skills)
- HOTs (Higher Order thinking skills)

(Note: An internal choice in approximately 33% questions can be provided)

The approximate weight age of different typology of questions may be as follows:

MUSIC



GUIDELINES TO PARENTS / GURADIANS

- 1. Parents should ensure that their wards come to school regularly and punctually, maintain personal hygiene and are dressed neatly in the school uniform.*
- 2. Parents should provide their specimen signatures in the School Almanac.*
- 3. Parents should notify to the school immediately if there is any change in their address, telephone number, or emergency contact person.*
- 4. Parents are not allowed to meet their children or the teachers, during school hours without the permission of the Principal in the school premises.*
- 5. Parents are advised to check the almanac of their ward regularly and ensure that they complete the assigned task in time.*
- 6. Parents are requested not to allow students to bring valuables to school. The school does not take responsibility for goods or money lost by students. Further, the school will not be held responsible in any way for the loss of any personal property. Children are not permitted to wear any jewellery in school. If they are found doing so, it will be confiscated.*
- 7. Parents are requested to be vigilant regarding the literature, friends and companions that their child chooses. Please supervise his/her web surfing and the television programmes s/he views everyday and also the amount of time spent on viewing these programmes daily.*
- 8. Parents should not allow their children to carry mobile phones or any other electronic gadgets to the school. The defaulter will be heavily fined and the instrument will be confiscated. The confiscated instrument will be returned only to the parent at the end of the academic session.*
- 9. Parents are informed that their children may be sent home after two warnings for arriving late. They should regularly check the bags of their wards to ensure that they do not carry objects which may cause harm to others.*
- 10. Children should be discouraged from buying eatables from street vendors.*
- 11. All articles found on the school premises will be placed in the Lost and Found Box. Students may claim these within a week, before or after school hours from maintenance incharge.*
- 12. All personal belongings of your child should be labelled so that they may be*

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- 13. Parents are requested to sign all the answer sheets of various tests and exams to keep track of their ward's academic progress.*
 - 14. Parents should attend Parent-Teacher Meet held periodically along with their child*
 - 15. Parents should avoid criticism of the teacher in the presence of the children because it undermines their respect for the teacher and the school.*
 - 16. Parents should dissuade their wards from seeking private tuitions, for this makes them unduly dependent on others*
 - 17. Parents should enrol their wards for free 'Remedial Classes' in the school if performance of their ward in academics is unsatisfactory*
 - 18. Parents should keep the child at home if he/she is suffering from a contagious disease like mumps, measles, chicken-pox, conjunctivitis should be sent to school only with a doctor's fitness certificate*
 - 19. Kindly ensure that the children pack their school bags for school as per the timetable to avoid being overloaded*
 - 20. Parents should inculcate in their wards respect for persons, property and environment.*
 - 21. Parents/ Guardian are requested not to take away their child/ward during school hours unless there is a major unforeseen eventuality*
 - 22. Parents should not allow their ward to ride a two wheeler to school unless he has a valid licence and wears a helmet.*
 - 23. Parents are requested to avoid making telephone calls to school office unless absolutely necessary*
 - 24. Do not send any sweets or gifts for distribution among the children or the staff on your child's birthday*

STUDY SKILLS

1. Be alert and attentive in the class.
2. Do not hesitate to ask your teacher, if the subject matter is not clear.
3. Take a break when you are tired.
4. Time is very precious: prepare a daily time table for study, play and rest for its better management.
5. If something is not clear to you, seek your friend's help who is good in that subject. If you are good in a subject, try to help your friend who is weak in that subject. While doing so, you will understand that topic better.
6. For effective learning, utilize the early hours of morning.
7. Allow more study time to subjects you find difficult.
8. Always revise the work done through the week during weekends.
9. Always carry a study kit that includes a ruler, pencils, pens erasers, paper and highlighters to school.
10. Consult the dictionary and the encyclopedias available in the school library regularly.
11. Take proper rest on the day before the examination. Do not continue studying till the very last moment.
12. For students of classes X & XII – it will be very useful if CBSE question papers of past 10 years are solved. Just reading from the book is not enough. It is important to write down your answer because only written expression gets you marks in the examination.
13. Develop the habit of self-study. Do not depend too much on tuitions. Attend remedial classes in the school instead.
14. Always remember that time devoted to studies will pay rich dividends in the years to come.

TIPS FOR TAKING A TEST

1. Listen attentively to directions from your teacher. Read carefully all the instructions given in the question paper before you begin.
2. Report to the invigilator if a page is missing from the question paper.
3. Attempt the questions you know well first, followed by difficult ones.
4. Leave a line after each answer.
5. All the rough work must be done on the answersheet only. State rough work on the top of the sheet.
6. Tick mark questions you need to come back to later.
7. Use all the time allowed. Re-read the directions and revise all your answers thoroughly before submitting the answersheet.
8. Carry a transport Examination Kit that contains pen, pencils erasers, sharpener and stapler.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- 1. Students are expected to attend school after the holidays on the reopening day itself.*
- 2. Students not returning punctually to school after the holidays are liable to have their names struck off the rolls.*
- 3. Students absent without prior notice will be fined Rs.10/- for each day of absence.*
- 4. As a rule, leave for social functions is not granted. Not more than two-days. Leave of absence, however, is granted to attend a sibling's wedding and one-day for a more distant relation.*
- 5. Absence without leave for more than ten days consecutively will render the students liable to removal from the school rolls.*
- 6. Leave of absence till not ordinarily be granted on the first and the last day of each term or of any vacation. If the student is absent without permission, his/ her name will be struck off the rolls.*
- 7. A student returning to school after an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate stating that the period of quarantine is over.*
- 8. Willful mass absenteeism shall be punished with a fine of Rs.50/- per day.*
- 9. Any pupil whose name has been struck off the rolls and who seeks re-admission shall have to pay the Admission Fee again.*
- 10.If progress in studies is unsatisfactory, the school has a right to ask for the withdrawal of the concerned student. This right also applies to cases of dishonesty, lack of manners. Disloyalty to school, gross misbehavior, cheating in the exam etc.*
- 11.It is compulsory for the students to complete 90% of the academic year's attendance to make them eligible for the final exams. The percentage however can be relaxed on medical grounds.*

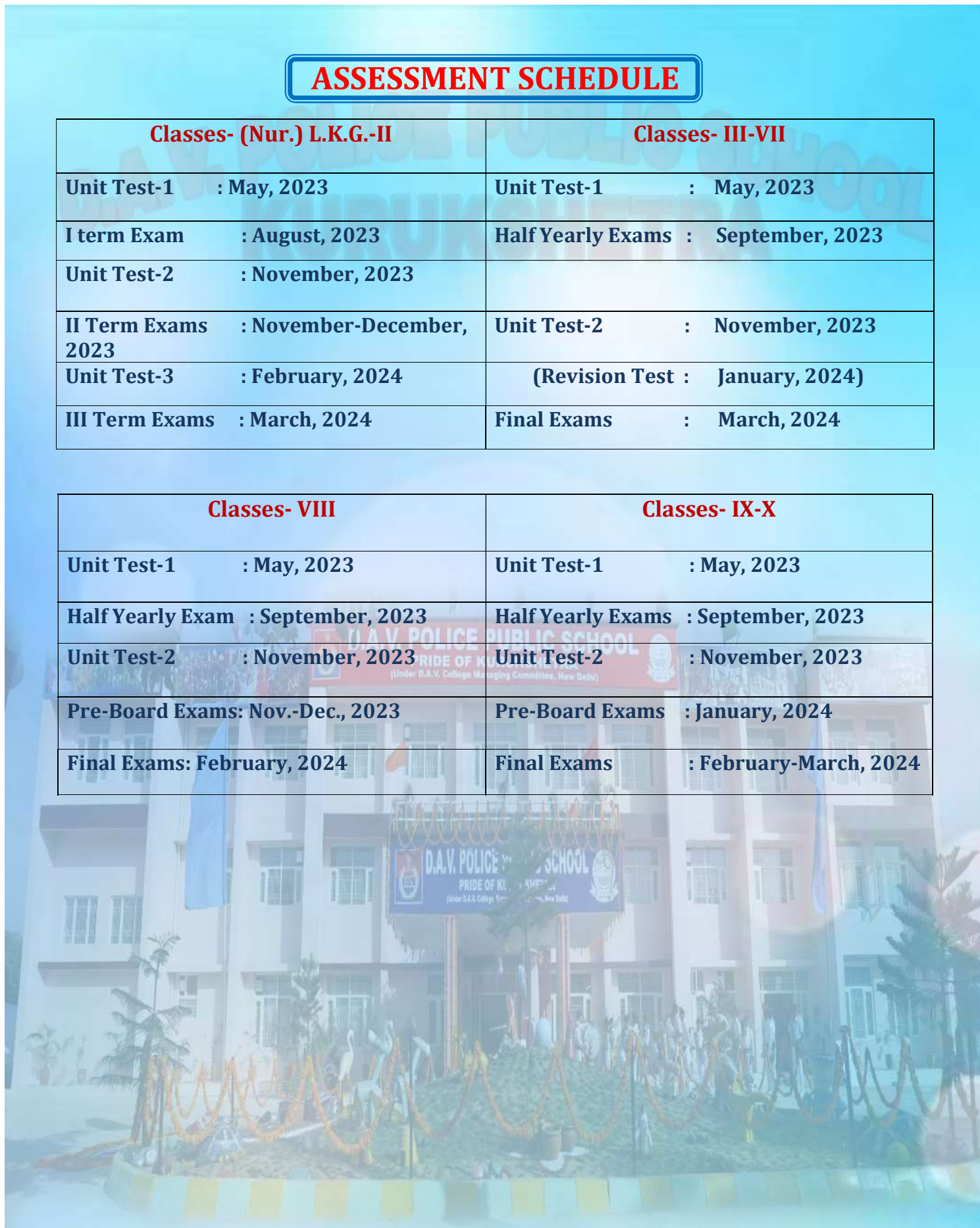
